Join us for a short, beautiful drive through the Angeles National Forest to the historic Mt. Wilson Observatory. The most scientifically productive astronomical observatory in history, this was the preeminent facility in the world in both stellar and solar studies during the first half of the twentieth century.

Mt. Wilson Solar Observatory was founded in 1904 by George Ellery Hale under the auspices of the Carnegie Institution of Washington. In that year, Hale brought the Snow Solar Telescope from Yerkes Observatory in Southern Wisconsin to the sunnier and steadier skies of Mt. Wilson to continue his studies of the sun. In 1919, soon after the completion of the 100-inch telescope, the word "solar" was dropped from the name. In 1907, the first automobile, a 1907 Franklin, made it to the summer of 5,715 feet.

Once we get to the summit, we will have lunch on your own at the sandwich shop known as the "Cosmic Café." A guided tour that takes about two hours will begin at 1:00 p.m.. We also have the option of a self-guided tour on your own and a copy of the self-guided tour brochure will be provided upon request.

We will be at an altitude of almost 6,000 feet, so even if the weather co-operates, you will need at least a light jacket. If it does not, we will have a back-up plan.

The Forest Service requires that vehicles parking within the Angeles National Forest, which includes the parking lot, display a National Forest Adventure Pass or a Golden Age Passport.
