Just a little north of metro LA/OC, the Antelope Valley is rich with wildflowers and is truly the birthplace of many of our nation's top aviation and aerospace vehicles. Please join us to visit the California Poppy Reserve and to explore our rich aerospace heritage at the Blackbird Airpark and the Joe Davies Heritage Airpark at Palmdale Plant 42. And, also to enjoy lunch and spend time with your fellow PI members. You can join in a caravan or meet us at the Poppy reserve or the restaurant. See addresses and directions on the reverse side.

What will I see? Each spring, the Antelope Valley California Poppy Reserve comes alive with the seasonal surprises of the Mojave Desert Grassland habitat. The duration and intensity of colors and scents vary from year to year, affected by differences in winter's precipitation. The wildflower blooms generally last from mid-March through mid-May. With the recent rains, they are expecting that this could be a spectacular year. The Heritage Airpark opened a few years ago on 26+ acres, as a place where present and future generations can go to celebrate our country's rich aviation history. Currently on display are over fifteen restored aircraft (A-4, A-7, AGM-28, C-140, F-4, F-5, F-14, F-86, F-100, F-101, F-104, F-105, T-33, T-38 and a Triumph), plus a 1/8-scale model of the B-2, and assorted engines and parts of other aircraft. The Blackbird Airpark, an annex of the Air Force Flight Test Center Museum at Edwards Air Force Base, offers a look at the unique Blackbird series of military aircraft. Included in the collection are the Lockheed SR-71A Blackbird reconnaissance plane, its predecessor, the A-12 test plane, and the ultra-secret D-21 drone. The recently completed Blackbird Heritage Wall commemorates the designers, crew members and others associated with the aircraft. The museum and its gift shop are open on Sunday until 5:00 p.m.
